# Málaga Centro

45 MINUTES · WALKING ROUTE

DESTINO DE CINE

We start this route in one of the main squares of the city centre, Plaza de la Merced (1), where the obelisk in homage to General Torrijos and the birthplace of Picasso, currently a museum, are located; moving south via Calle Granada, we can visit the Church of Santiago Apostol, one of the oldest temples in the city and where the painter was baptized. In this same street is the popular bodega El Pimpi, located in a mansion dating from the 18th century and where you can taste typical local wines while observing in its barrels a collection of autographs of well-known personalities from the world of flamenco, politics and the arts.

We continue towards Calle San Agustín (2), a cobbled street that together with the previous locations we can see in National's Geographic miniseries 'Genius: Picasso', in which our most international actor, Antonio Banderas, plays the painter. Just steps away stands the Palacio de Buenavista, home to Malaga's Picasso Museum which features a spectacular collection of works by the painter and next to this building, the Convent of the Augustinians, from which you can see a beautiful perspective of Malaga's Cathedral (3) a.k.a. "La manquita". Inside, scenes from the feature film 'The Bridge of San Luis Rey' with Robert de Niro as well as Netflix's series 'Warrior Nun', were filmed. To the west of the Cathedral, the Plaza del Obispo can be seen in one of the scenes of the Celine Dione's biopic, 'Aline, the voice of love'.

Continuing south, we cross Calle Molina Lario (4), where "Lady Di and Prince Charles" greeted their fans in a scene that recreates their trip to Australia for 'The Crown'. On its corner with Calle Cortina del Muelle we find the Hotel AC Málaga; its terrace, which is a must, offers magnificent views of the city and its façade and the pool, also appear in one of the sequence shots of the praised series. Leaving the Hotel towards the east, we arrive at the Palacio de la Aduana (5), current headquarters to the Museo de Málaga, another of 'Warrior Nun's' locations. We continue along the Avenida Cervantes to find a number of buildings with

history such as the Casita del Jardinero, Malaga's University Rectorate, the Bank of Spain and the Town Hall (6) colloquially known as "La Casona del Parque" also featured in films such as 'El Bulevar del Ron' with Brigitte Bardot and "Operation Mincemeat", starring, among others, Colin Firth. La Casona also adjoins the Jardines de Pedro Luis Alonso, which blooms with roses many months of the year.

We then cross the Paseo del Parque to the Paseo de los Curas and arrive at the Port (7), where we can walk through the Palmeral de las Sorpresas and the Muelle Uno, contemplating from one side the city's the magnificence skyline with the Castillo de Gibralfaro and the Alcazaba and from the other, the Mediterranean Sea and La Farola (8), the only lighthouse in Spain which is referred to in feminine. Very close to La Farola and the Malagueta Beach, we find the Paseo Marítimo Pablo Ruiz Picasso (9), a location that you can recognize in the last scene of the Swedish version of 'Millenium I', 'El Camino de los Ingleses' directed by Antonio Banderas, 'Toro' for which several car chases were recorded and in the Spanish TV series 'Malaka' which was fully set in the city. Then, you can't miss the imposing Gran Hotel Miramar featured in 'Fire over Africa', 'At the End of the Night' and most recently, 'The Crown'. In this area, the Malagueta, you will find several "chiringuitos": beach bars where you can taste our most traditional gastronomy.

The Botanical Garden La Concepción (10) has more than 150 years of history and thanks to the seeds brought from overseas by the ships of the exporting bourgeoisie of Malaga in the 19th century, houses one of the best collections of tropical and subtropical flora in Europe. This location has become in its own right one of the most beloved ones for the camera....and a little secret, one where you can taste some exquisite cakes in its cafeteria in a unique environment!!
